Kindergarten – Fifth Grade
Preparation Guidelines for Black History Month Essay Contest

Each essay should include a cover page. The Cover Page should consist of the participant's name, title of the essay and the date. The name of the participant should only be written on the cover page so that their identity would remain anonymous to those evaluating essays.

Please refer to the K- 5 Rubric to specify the level of performance expected for several levels of quality.

Third – Fifth Grade Essay Topics

Fifth Grade

Compare and Contrast

Prepare a two to three page essay to compare and contrast events that prepared David to become King of Israel and events that prepared Barack Obama to become President of the United States.

Third – Fourth Grade

A Letter to Obama

Prepare a one to two page letter to Barack Obama that briefly describes the importance of him winning the Noble Peace Prize. Include a reflection of one event of the Civil Rights Movement and a Psalm from the Bible to offer him encouragement throughout his presidency.

Kindergarten – Fifth Grade Preparation Guidelines for Black History Oratorical Contest

Orators will be judged by their usage of the following:

1. Pitch
2. Articulation
3. Speed
4. Delivery which include use of eye contact as well as hand gestures
5. Voice Volume
6. Time
7. Content Applies to Fifth Grade Orators Only
8. Originality Applies to Fifth Grade Orators Only

Memorize and prepare and original response to one of the following poems. The poem and response should be no longer than 1 minute but no shorter than 30 seconds. All original responses must be memorized as well.

Kindergarten Contestants: In addition to memorizing the poem for oral recitations, prepare a presentation of artistic expression (i.e. drawing or painting) or model (i.e. Lego or play dough) to demonstrate what the poem means to you.

First and Second Grade Contestants: Prepare a 3 to 5 handwritten sentence explanation of what the poem means to you. These ideas should be presented and recited prior to the oral recitation of the poem during the contest.

All orators must present their orations during the preliminary rounds on either Thursday, February 25th or Friday, February 26th before advancing to the Oratorical Contest on Saturday, February 27th at 12 noon. No parents will be allowed to enter or be present in the room during the preliminary rounds. Furthermore, contestants will not be allowed to use notes as they present their speech. Each orator should have memorized their recitation/excerpts before presenting in the preliminary round on either the 25th or 26th of February. And each contestant must bring at least one copy of their speech, selected excerpts, and original response on the day they have been assigned to present in the preliminary round. If you have advanced to the Oratorical contest after the preliminary round, you will receive a phone call from Rev. Mackey, Rev. Allen or Mrs. Lynn Mackey the night of Friday, February 26th. If you do not receive a call, it is still vitally important that you attend the Oratorical Contest the following day because the third place winners of each classification will be announced along with the first and second place winners. That very easily could be you.

Essay and Oratorical Workshops

The essay and oratorical workshop is designed for students that desire to perfect their essay and/or oratorical skills. Experts in the field of oratory and literature will assist students with any questions or concerns regarding their essay and/or oration. The computer lab will be available during each workshop session.

Essay and Oratorical Workshop Locations

Middle School, High School, and College Essay Workshops will be located in room 216. Middle School, High School, and College Oratorical Workshops will be located in room 217.
